

#### **January 2014 Mantua Methodist Vine**

This exciting, unending series researches the KJV Bible with other sources.

\*\*A Congregation member submitted this question:

#### WHEN DOES GOD'S PATIENCE END?

The very familiar Old Testament documentations of The Great Flood, the Assyrian conquest, and David's punishment are examples. In my opinion, a fine example of HIS wrath when HIS patience ended begins with the infamous epic of:

#### SODOM AND GOMORRAH (SODOM)!!!

GOD came down in person to inspect the detestable practices of Sodom and Gomorrah. HE visited Abraham prior to his inspection. The evidence of HIS presence is given in (NRSV) Genesis 18:13-14 when GOD responded to Sarah's laughter, "The LORD said to Abraham, 'Why did Sarah laugh... Is anything too wonderful for the LORD'?" The situation's depravity required the LORD's personal visit. HE who knows all came in person to deliver the punishment...as will Jesus. Chaos will be the rule for those not saved on the Day of Judgment. Be prepared!!!

#### THE PHYSICAL SITUATION

Some opinions deny The Valle (Valley) of Siddim's Seismic Faults involvement in the final destruction. The Valley is sitting on a potential cauldron of asphalt (slime in the Bible), sulfur and salt: a real potpourri for disaster. The area's history is ridden with earthquakes.

#### THE EVENT

(NRSV) Genesis 19:24-25, "Then the LORD rained on Sodom and Gomorrah sulfur and fire from the LORD out of Heaven; and HE overthrew those cities, and all the Plain, and all the inhabitants of the cities, and what grew on the ground." A catastrophe of the first order!!!

Sulfur and fire---burning sulfur with its horribly, suffocating and strangling fumes, the fire of the flaming oil-rich black-fuming asphalt raining down sticking to human flesh, gigantic earth eruptions toppling all traces of civilization--- the fury of our LORD obliterating Sodom and Gomorrah forever.

(NRSV) Genesis 19:28, "...and he (Abraham) looked down toward Sodom and Gomorrah... and saw the smoke of the land going up like the smoke of a furnace."

#### ADD A LITTLE SALT

(NRSV) Genesis 19:26, "But Lot's wife, behind him, looked back, and she became a pillar of salt." The Arabs call the Great Salt Mass in the Valley the "Mountain of Sodom". Salt melts @ 1,000 degrees Fahrenheit. To come down and cover Lot's wife, Biblical scholars feel the salt was in molten form. The wife was enveloped in a liquid, fiery agony...for disobedience. I witnessed a molten salt (1,000 degrees) accident: men, screaming in extreme pain, burning in fiery salt. Later, large fabric-like roles were swept into piles ...the "fabric" was human skin.

#### REMEMBER!!!

We must maintain the necessity for watchfulness. Sodom and Gomorrah were not warned. We have had many previews expressed in the Bible. The Fires of Hell are still there...and we know it. .

#### THE BIBLE SAYS

(NRSV) Matthew 24:36, "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

(KJV) Revelation 14:11, "And the smoke of their torment ascendeth up for ever and ever: and they have no rest day or night,..." (See Genesis 19:28 above. The Fires of Hell is sin's reward.)

# This is My Story By Sue Seibel

When we were young and just starting a family Walt and I bought our first home. It was perfect for us the people around us were all about our age and all children were in the same age group. We became very close.

Most of my neighbors were Catholic and were becoming involved in the Charismatic Movement. They decided to start a prayer group and asked me to join them. A woman from their church came to our first meeting to instruct us in the format to use for our prayers. Basically we started with thanks and asked God to be with us, then we offered up our prayers. Last we had a period of silent prayer where we opened our minds to God, then shared any thoughts or inspirations with the group. At the end of the session we prayed and invited Jesus into our hearts. When we were done praying I felt a strong warmth spread through me and I knew something had changed.

The group was very successful. We prayed for ourselves and soon were getting requests from friends and friends of friends. On the night of one meeting, I received a phone call from my mother, she told me my sister-in-law had contracted spinal meningitis and was not expected to live but if she lived she would probably be a vegetable. My brother, who was in the Navy, was being flown in from the Persian Gulf.

Of course our group prayed for her. During the session, where we opened ourselves to God, one of the girls in our group told us the story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, had come vividly into her brain and she saw Jesus walking out of the flames carrying a person in His arms. A feeling of peace came on me and I knew she would be alright.

The next morning, my brother called to say that they had given her a broad spectrum antibiotic and packed her in ice. When she awoke she was perfectly fine. Yeah God!!

This was not a single incident. There were many answered prayers, of course not all were as we hoped but I believe that all the answers were the best. To see God at work is a wondrous thing.

### Shopping Online?

If you are an on-line shopper, you can help the UMC of Mantua. All you have to do is shop through the UMC Market website. Doing so does not change the cost of what you purchase. The retailers will make a donation to us. Please read below. It is a matter of signing up and putting Mantua in the church box. You will be asked to choose between Barnsboro and our church. Make sure choose Mantua.

The United Methodist Church, in partnership with major online retailers, has created a shopping portal that gives your church a 1 to 9 percent commission for purchases made by members of your church. They can donate to your church also by booking travel, hotel room and car rental through UMCmarket.

All shoppers have to do is create an account and buy products and merchandise from partner retailers through **UMCmarket.org**. There's no increased cost or hidden fees. They buy items for the same prices they would pay on those retailers' sites.

### It's simple and easy — it's <u>UMCmarket</u>.

What is required of you and your church members to make this happen?

- 1. Visit <u>UMCMarket.org</u> and create an account. During the account setup, designate a beneficiary church to which the commission for their purchases will go. (Select Mantua)
- 2. Log into UMCMarket and shop at the partner retailers or you can use the free down loadable add-on for their Web browser and shop at the partner retailers.
- 3. Your church will receive a check from UMCMarket.
