Much has been made recently of the Presidential pardons that were handed down by President Obama when he left office. Some feel there were too many, and others understood why he did what he did. However, Presidential pardons are nothing new. Here are a few of the more well-known pardons: President Obama has not been the only U.S. president to issue pardons. Here are some other famous Presidential pardons:

The Whiskey Rebellion (1795) -- Eager to put down a rebellion by Western Pennsylvanians who refused to pay the Federal excise tax on whiskey, President Washington led an army of 13,000 men to the area and quickly squashed the rebellion. It was the only time an American president has directly commanded an army in the field during his term of office. Two rebel leaders were convicted of treason and sentenced to death by hanging. Eager for reconciliation and no longer worried that the rebellion was a threat to the new nation, Washington pardoned the two men.

Brigham Young (1858) -- In 1857, the United States went to war with a church: the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (the Mormons). Alarmed by Mormon control over the Utah territory, and scandalized by reports of Mormon polygamy, President James Buchanan sent an army expedition to reassert federal control. There was never a question that the U.S. Army would prevail, but one incident proved an obstacle to peace. In September, 1857, the Mormon militia massacred the members of a non-Mormon wagon train of settlers at a place called Mountain Meadows. Although it is unclear whether Brigham Young -- head of the LDS church -- had personally ordered the massacre, he was widely blamed for it. Buchanan pardoned Young in order to end the conflict peacefully.

Eugene Debs (1921) -- The Socialist labor leader and firebrand Eugene Debs polled over a million votes when he ran for president in 1920, even though he was in jail at the time. Debs had been given a 10-year jail term in 1918 after giving a speech encouraging men to dodge the military draft. In 1921, President Warren G. Harding commuted Debs' sentence, although he stopped short of awarding him a full pardon. In 1976, Congress posthumously restored Debs' full citizenship rights.

Richard Nixon (1974) -- Eager for the nation to move on after the Watergate scandal, President Gerald Ford pardoned his predecessor, Richard Nixon, heading off what could have been a lengthy prosecution. The move was controversial because some suspected it was part of a secret deal made at the time Nixon resigned his office, elevating then-Vice President Ford to the presidency.

Patty Hearst (2001) -- In 1974, newspaper heiress Patty Hearst was kidnapped by a terrorist group known as the Symbionese Liberation Army. In a bizarre psychological twist -- possibly an example of the "Stockholm syndrome" -- Hearst switched sides, took the name "Tania" and joined her captors, eventually participating with them in a bank robbery. Sentenced to seven years, Hearst's sentence was commuted 22 months later by President Jimmy Carter. In 2001, at Carter's urging, President Bill Clinton offered her a full pardon.*

As we approach Holy Week, we have all received a pardon. That is what the story of the cross is all about. All of us deserve to be sentenced to death because of sin, any sin. Romans 6:23 says the

wages of sin is death. Jesus' death on the cross, though, carrying the weight of all our sin, broke the power that sin has over us. God's gift of love has conquered sin, so that we are pardoned. Then he rose again so that the death sentence no longer holds. The second part of Romans 6:23 says that the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. The best part is that we don't have to wait for someone to pronounce it as is has already happened. This Easter Season, let us give thanks to God for our pardon and the gift of eternal life!


All children MUST be accompanied by an adult.






