October 2012 II Mantua Methodist Vine <u>Lilith, The Mythological First Wife of Adam</u>

This exciting, unending series provides a learning journey researching the familiar and not so familiar Gospel passages. Biblical references are KJV unless noted.

Mythology Claims Two Original Female Creations

Lilith first appears in the Babylonian Talmud during the Captivity. She is thought to be related to a class of female demons, *Lilitu*, in the Mesopotamian records (which includes Babylonia). So what has this to do with the Bible?

Genesis 1:27, "So God created humankind in his image,... male and <u>female</u> he created hem." (Wife #1 is *Lilith*, the first female creation.)

Genesis 2:7, "...LORD God formed man from the dust ..., and breathed into his nostrils...life;..."

Genesis 2:21, "...the LORD God caused a deep sleep upon the man,...he took one of his ribs..." Genesis 2:22, "...he made (the rib) into a woman..." (Wife #2 is *Eve.*)

Lilith's Origins

Lilith originated in the Ancient Near East. A wilderness spirit known as "<u>The Dark Maiden</u>" appears in "The Descent of Inanna" (circa 3000 B C). Lilith means "<u>The Night</u>". Her emotional and spiritual characteristics of darkness are terror, sensuality, and unbridled freedom. Circa 700 BC, another Syrian tablet states, "O flyer in a dark chamber, go away at once, O Lili!" (In my opinion this describes a modern day witch.)

Lilith Fails As Adam's First Wife

Lilith rebelled against GOD's plan for Adam. Asserting her "independent rights", conflicts quickly erupted. According to legend, this bred rebellion with Lilith running into the wilderness screaming her defiance. The Angel Gabriel found her, weeping at a cold stream, fearful of GOD's wrath. Gabriel assured Lilith freedom from death. But, she would be a night demon smothering newborns (crib death) and sleeping with single men to breed more demons. Today, a red thread tied to a crib is supposed "stop" Lilith.

Lilith has made her way into the Bible. Isaiah 34:14 placed her in an inhospitable wilderness. Isaiah states, "Wildcats will meet with hyenas, goat-demons shall call to each other; there too Lilith shall repose, and find a place to rest."

Is Lilith's Spirit Active Today?

The Talmud's Lilith is a night spirit, cursed with uncontrolled sexuality, breeding demons. Lilith's killer role of newborns is expanded thru modern-day selective abortions of the unborn. The feminist movement adopted Lilith, as a symbol, to reject virginity and accept sexual freedom. These spiritual followers of Lilith, unwittingly introduce AIDS, a medical catastrophe, with a soft, invitational "hello". Remember Fornication?

Obituary
