

### From Pastor Doug...

By the time you receive this newsletter, Election Day will be upon us. As I reflect on the campaigns this year, there has been much blaming, accusations, and hurtful talk. As if an election doesn't have the potential for this kind of behavior, I believe that social media like Facebook and Twitter have magnified it even more. You can't look at Facebook without seeing and reading all about how terrible one candidate is as opposed to the other.

Susan Fuchs posted something on Facebook that I saw that reminded me of something. It was a take-off of Donald Trump's campaign slogan "Make America Great Again." It said, "Make America Kind Again." Right now, there are divisions in our country and there is too much meanness. Wouldn't it be great if we could end the meanness and move toward a more kind existence together?

Paul, in Galatians 5 talks about the characteristics of those who live according to the flesh, that is, who are not in tune with the Spirit of God or who don't seek to live as someone who is led by the Spirit of God. He says that those who don't live by the Spirit exhibit the following: fornication, impurity, licentiousness (immorality), idolatry, sorcery, enmities (hostility or animosity), strife (angry or bitter disagreement), jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. The middle part of the list sure sounds familiar and not just from the candidates!

He goes on to say that the fruit of the Spirit, that is, the characteristics of those who live according to the Spirit show characteristics of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. He ends the section by saying, "If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another."

I will be glad when the campaign season is over. How different would a campaign look, would our responses on Facebook look, if we would allow ourselves to be guided by the Spirit. How would our world be different if we would allow God's Spirit to lead us? While I know that there will always be those who choose to live in ways opposed to the Spirit, what if we who claim to be followers of Christ would follow the Spirit and now allow the old ways to creep in? Let's all do our part to fill our country, our world, with as much fruit of the Spirit as we can and maybe we will make it kind again.
