

From Pastor Doug...

Sitting here just a few days out from the violence in Orlando, I still find it hard to find words. There is a lot of talk, guessing as to why, wondering if it could have been prevented, trying to figure out who or what political persuasion or religion to blame, etc. etc. etc. Not to diminish the number of victims (and our prayers go out for all of the individuals and the families who experienced the loss), the scope of the evil, or the toll this has taken on all of us, this is not the first time that something like this has happened, nor, unfortunately because of sinful human nature and evil, will it be the last. That is the nature of evil, it will find a way to express itself. So what is our response? I think in any of these type situations, our task is not one of judgment, blame, or criticism.

The statement of faith from the United Church of Canada, I think, guides us in our task, not just in times like these, but always. It says:

We are called to be the church: to celebrate God's presence, to love and to serve others, to seek justice and resist evil, to proclaim Jesus, crucified and risen, our judge and our hope.

In tragedy, we are called to love and serve and to seek justice for all of God's creatures and creation. This is exactly what Jesus did. When he helped people, he didn't stop to ask first about religion or nationality, gender or orientation, citizen or non-citizen, or political persuasion before demonstrating love. We should do no less. We are also called to put aside any judgements we might make and allow the one who is worthy to judge, the crucified and risen Jesus, take care of the judgement. If there is any hope of transformation of people who perpetrate evil, it won't happen through judgment, it will only happen through love. Not only is this our best response at time like this, but it may be our only hope of preventing more of these types of tragedy. You can't legislate or force or create public policy to curb evil. Only the people of God living out the ethics of God's kingdom, truly being the church, with the power and presence of the Holy Spirit will have any hope of doing so.

As Paul says in Ephesians 6 (The Message) This is no afternoon athletic contest that we'll walk away from and forget about in a couple of hours. This is for keeps, a life-or-death fight to the finish against the Devil and all his angels.

¹³⁻¹⁸ Be prepared. You're up against far more than you can handle on your own. Take all the help you can get, every weapon God has issued, so that when it's all over but the shouting you'll

still be on your feet. Truth, righteousness, peace, faith, and salvation are more than words. Learn how to apply them. You'll need them throughout your life. And the promise in this also comes from the end of the creed that I quoted earlier. In life, in death, in life beyond death, God is with us. We are not alone. Thanks be to God.
