



Dear Rev. Baitinger, Lorraine and Church Family at Mantua United Methodist Church,

The holidays seem to have flashed by in an instant this year! I can remember, as a young girl, hearing my mother say that "the older you get, the faster time moves". All those decades ago, that seemed like a senseless statement, but the older I get, the more I understand her logic!!

Your Christmas baskets were- as they always are- amazing! My clients are always astounded by the personal touches that are unique to each basket- gifts carefully thought out to let the person know that they are not just a number or a first name to you... they are individuals for whom you care deeply. And for many of the families with whom I work, this is a feeling seldom experienced. Thank you so very much, both from our PetPALS' clients and from me for having made their Christmas such a gift of love as well as of food!

This year, God's gift to us came in the form of an additional basket that had been given to me for use by someone who might need it. One of my PetPALS' volunteers was heading to upper Burlington County to deliver two baskets to a senior center where we have clients, and I asked if she would be willing to take it to this facility. When she arrived, she learned that her client had been taken to the hospital and was not expected to return for several weeks. Now she had not one, but TWO unclaimed baskets in her possession!! When she went to the second client's door (a woman who is a friend of the hospitalized client), she suggested that Lynn give her friend's basket to a retired pastor who lives in that building.

Taking the baskets to the pastor's apartment, Lynn asked if she might know of someone who could use them. That pastor began to cry. It seems that for every holiday, she prepares a huge meal and invites everyone in the building who would otherwise be alone or unable, for whatever reason, to have a holiday meal. On a fixed income herself, this year the number of lonely, hungry people in the building had grown to a point where the pastor was unsure of having enough to feed everyone. She told Lynn she had been praying for two weeks that God would find a way for her to get two more turkeys to help feed those who needed her help. And there stood Lynn- with your tremendously generous gifts in hand (INCLUDING ONE TURKEY AND ONE HAM!!), and she was reduced to grateful tears. Because of you and the giver of the "extra" basket, those baskets fed not two people, but many individuals who needed to know that someone loved them! What a phenomenal gift of God's mercy and grace, and a reminder of the good that can be done when we network together as God's children!

Thank you for one of the best Christmases ever! May each of you and those you love enjoy the blessings of health and happiness, family and togetherness as enter a New Year filled with opportunity to serve the God who Loves us beyond measure! We are so appreciative of the ministry and work we share together in Christ's name!!
