On my desk is a calendar of silly things that people have said. The one for Father's day goes like this: Attorney: What was your father's name?

Witness: I don't know, we always called him "Dad."

While humorous, it makes me think of two things. First, it reminds me of the term that Jesus used when he talked to his heavenly father. It was the word, "Abba" which is the Aramaic word for of the word "Father" "Dad" and "Daddy." There was only one word, and regardless of which way Jesus meant it, we understand that he used it because he had a relationship with God. It was a familiar father-son relationship. It is a model of a parent-child relationship with God that we need to have. We should be comfortable knowing God as our parent; one who loves and cares for us and with whom we can share our needs and desires. What have you done recently to nourish that relationship?

The second thing I see in this is that while this witness did not know his father's name, our Heavenly Father always knows our name. In Biblical times, when you knew someone's name it not only meant that you knew something of the person's personality, but that you also had some influence over the person. God knows us intimately. God is our creator and made us who we are. God wants us to live in obedience to God's will, so we are influenced and guided by the Holy Spirit. Isn't it great to have a relationship with someone who knows us so intimately and loves us so deeply?

This Father's Day, let us give thanks for our earthly fathers and grandfathers, but also to our Heavenly Father who knows our name, calls us into relationship, and loves us!
