Here's how you can help:

Pre-Visit Preparations

On the Sunday our Family Promise guests arrive, be at Mantua UMC at noon (when Sunday School ends).

Set up beds (blow up mattresses and put on sheets).

Hang welcome signs around the church.

Check bathrooms to ensure after-church cleanliness.

Lay out towels.

Morning Van Drivers

Drive our guests from Mantua UMC to the Family Center in Glassboro.

From Monday to Friday, volunteers arrive at Mantua UMC by 5:30 a.m.

On Saturday and Sunday, volunteers arrive at Mantua UMC by 7 a.m.

Evening Van Drivers

Drive our guests from the Family Center in Glassboro back to Mantua UMC.

From Sunday to Saturday, volunteers pick up about 5:30 p.m.

Dinner Hosts

Provide and serve dinner for up to 14 guests at Mantua UMC.

From Sunday to Saturday, volunteers have dinner ready to eat by 6 p.m.

Often the dinner and/or evening hosts eat with the families, so a little extra food is needed.

Dinners should be nutritionally balanced and consider all ages and food allergies (this information will be shared ahead of

It's a fun opportunity for families, friends, and our church groups to get together in fellowship with our guests. Consider inviting a friend or two to join you!

Evening Hosts

Chat and visit with our guests during and after dinner at Mantua UMC.

From Sunday to Saturday, volunteers stay from about 6:30 to 8:30 p.m., when the overnight hosts arrive.

Ensure that you and/or the guests keep the kitchen tidy

Consider extending your visit by signing up for both dinner and evening host. Some guests really like talking and meeting new people!

Overnight Hosts

This job is really easy... all you need to do is SLEEP! J

- From Sunday to Saturday, volunteers sleep on luxurious air mattresses in a Sunday School room.
- Arrive by 8:30 p.m., and finish at 5:30 a.m. when the morning van driver arrives.
- Two hosts are required each night.

Post-visit Breakdown

On the Sunday our guests leave, be at Mantua UMC by 7 a.m.

- Deflate and put away beds.
- Straighten Sunday School rooms and bathrooms.
- Place bagged sheets in the Narthex.

More Ways to Help

Pray for our guests, and pray for our ministry to continue and flourish. Our guests deeply appreciate the roof over their heads and food to eat, not only for themselves, but especially for their children.

Take home a bag of laundry to wash when our guests leave! Just bring it back in a bag labeled "Family Promise Clean Laundry", which you can leave this in the narthex or McConnell Hall.

Consider a small financial donation. When our guests visit, we provide them not only with dinner each night, but also with food and supplies they will use at the Family Center during the week.

Spread the word about the great things we accomplish with this ministry. There is strength in numbers, and the more volunteers we have, the stronger our ministry will become.
